All items are for competition, exhibition, education and demonstration purposes. Sale of entries is not permitted while on display during the Fair. Since we are trying to increase the number of exhibitors we have added Divisions and Classes. We hope there is a category for everyone (home schooled students and adults) to participate.

Entries **for Arts & Crafts** will be accepted Monday, January 23, 2023 at the Charlotte County Fairgrounds, 2333 El Jobean Rd., Port Charlotte, FL 33948 in the **Arts & Crafts and Plants Building** (behind the main display building) from 9 A.M. to 12 Noon. This includes **original artwork, paintings and photography.**

Plants will be accepted Wednesday, January 25, 2023 from 9 am to 12 noon.

Food will be accepted Thursday, January 26, 2023. Only unopened food will be returned. The rules have really changed for this category so be sure to check the **Rules and Regulations.**

All items must be picked up Monday, February 6, 2023 between 10 A.M. and 2 P.M. **All remaining items will be disposed of.**

All entries must follow the **Rules and Regulations** found on this: **TheCharlotteCountyFair.com** website. The 2 page entry form is also on the website and must be completed before bringing in your items. When entries are brought in a claim check will be given for each item. You must bring the exhibitor portion of the claim check to pick up your items.

All articles must be clean, handiwork of the exhibitor, and have been completed between January 1, 2022 and January 23, 2023.

All articles cannot have been exhibited at the CC Fair previously.

No larger than 12" x 18"

Division 212 Origami

Use any type of paper. No glue, staples, tape or any other kind of adhesive may be used to hold the origami piece together. Entries may not be cut or torn.

Division 301

All General Rules Apply

One (1) entry per person, per class

Items must be in clear, standard, sealed canning jars with lids in good condition - dirty or rusted rings will result in elimination. Each entry must be labeled with the name of the product and date canned - must have been canned since January 1, 2022. Recipe and method of canning must be attached to each entry. No artificial coloring permitted. Bring 2 jars of the same item, first jar for display, second jar can be small to be opened and judged.

Division 302

All General Rules Apply

One (1) entry per person per class

Recipes can be from scratch or mix with other items added.

Entry must have the recipe attached on a 4 x 6" index card, and showing if a mix was used. Entries must be in or on a disposable covered container. Bread and cakes must be in their original uncut

form - no "pieces" will be accepted. Cupcakes, Cookies, Brownies, Muffins, Rolls & Candy - 10 pieces per entry required.
No entries will be returned to the exhibitor.

FAUX Cake Decorating

Division 303

Rules:

All General Rules Apply

Your entry is a dummy decorated cake with faux icing.

Cakes will be on display the entire fair

Entries will be judged on originality, creativity, workmanship and degree of difficulty and overall appearance.

This competition is open to all cake decorators as well as culinary and cake decorating students and will be divided as follows:

Class A: Those starting out, Ages 13-20

Class B: Non-professional decorators who primarily decorate cakes as a hobby. Ages 21 & over

Class C: Advanced/professional - those who sell their cakes and/or teach cake decorating. No moving parts are allowed. Cake base is to be no larger than 20" x 20" as maximum display area is 24". Ages 21 & over.
Entry may be the work of one exhibitor or a group.
Only one entry per exhibitor or group.

Recycled Art

All General Rules Apply See Page ____

Limit 2 entries per exhibitor

Design an item from recyclable and/or non-recyclable material where the materials are used for a purpose other than its original use and remade.

Project may use many different materials.

No poison or hazardous materials may be used or displayed.

A picture of the item must be taken before the recycling process and must be included with each entry and your description. A description of the item(s) prior to start and the procedure used to accomplish your new creation must be included.

Please type or print description on one or more index cards.

Judging will be based on descriptive information, construction difficulty, creative use of item, and overall success in the reclamation process.

Examples of items to make: jewelry, baskets, ornament, toys, wall hangings, vests, etc.

All entries except canvas gallery wrap paintings must be ready to hang.

Only wire hangers all the way across back of frames will be accepted, no saw tooth hangers. Tape is not allowed on frame or back.

Names must appear on back of entry, upper right corner.

All entries must be consistent with the family program and Fair Management reserves the right to display or not to display any item.

PLANTS

All items are for competition, exhibition, education and demonstration purposes. Sale of entries is not permitted while on display during the Fair. Since we are trying to increase the number of exhibitors we have added Divisions and Classes. We hope there is a category for everyone to participate.

The Plant Department is for Container Grown Ornamental Plants, Vegetables & Fruit Plants, and Citrus, Fruits, and Nuts.

Any items that do not meet the requirements will not be accepted. If an item is accepted as an oversight, it may later be disqualified and/or not judged or displayed.

Entries **for PLANTS** will be accepted Wednesday January 25, 2023 at the Charlotte County Fairgrounds, 2333 El Jobean Rd., Port Charlotte, FL 33948 in the **Arts & Crafts and Plants Building** (behind the main display building) from 9 A.M. to 12 Noon with a limit of 3 items per division.

All items must be picked up Monday, February 6, 2023 between 10 A.M. and 2 P.M. **The Fair Association is not responsible for and will dispose of any remaining articles not picked up by 2 P.M. February 6, 2023.**

All entries must follow the **Rules and Regulations** found on this: **TheCharlotteCountyFair.com** website. The 2 page entry form is also on the website and must be completed before bringing in your items. When

entries are brought in a claim check will be given for each item. You must bring the exhibitor portion of the claim check to pick up your items.

Each entry will be judged on its own merit, using the Danish System of Judging. Judging is done by the most qualified judges available and their decision will be final. The names of the exhibitors are concealed during judging so that each entry will be judged fairly on its own merit. The entry of only one item in a division does not necessarily guarantee the top award for that entry.

All exhibits in the Plant Department are under the management of the Fair Association. The Fair Association will take every precaution to protect exhibits, however, the Association, its Officers or Agents will not be responsible for accident, loss, or damage of any entry. The Fair Association reserves the right to display or not to display at any time.

Plant Rules:

All General Rules apply

Limit of three (3) entries per Division.

All plant material must be fresh and have been grown by the exhibitor

When entering, include plant species & if known, variety. Indicate how plant was grown: Seed (S), Graft (G), Cutting (C), Division (D). If your entry has to be watered, please include tray or saucer to prevent water drips. Include written instructions for the care of plant while at Fair.

Evasive plants accepted only if grown in controlled containers, if not in controlled containers, they will not be judged or receive ribbons or premiums.

Standards for all Judging:

1. Clean, free from injury, disease, insects, and uniform in size, shape & color.
2. Of best market size & Quality.
3. Following General & Division Rules.

The variety name is to be noted on the entry form

All entries must be clean, free from insects and diseases, and in good condition

Water instructions should be noted on entry ticket

One plant per container – except Herb Gardens

All entries must be displayed on a 8 inch or 9 inch paper plate, except for entries in pots

No glass, ceramic or plastic plates

Division 201 Vegetable and Fruit Plants

Class A: Vegetable

Eggplant, Broccoli, Squash, Zucchini, Cabbage, Lettuce, Spinach, Chard, etc.

Class B: Herb Dish Garden

Class C: Herb Plant

Class D: Pepper Plant

Class E: Seedling/Propagation

Multiple plants in container

Class F: Tomato

Citrus, Fruits, and Nut Rules:

Fruits entered in this category would be fruits that are not considered to be vegetables in any part of their growth, i.e. Peaches, Oranges, Tangerines, Grapefruit, Nuts

Each entry must consist of two (2) examples of each fruit displayed.

Exception to this rule, due to the size and mature of the display, is pumpkins, watermelons, etc. – need only one (1) example.

Each entry must be of comparable size .

All fruits must be displayed on sturdy 8 inch or 9 inch paper plate.

No glass, ceramic or plastic plates accepted.

All fruits entered must be cleaned, free from insects and diseases, and in good condition. One fruit may be cut and examined. Entries may be washed, but not waxed, oiled or polished with any additive. Entries may be removed at the discretion of the chairperson for reasons such as insects, etc. after judging.

Judging Standards, using the Danish System of Judging

About the Danish System of Judging

The Danish System of Judging is based upon established standards of quality for each type of product. In this system each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets the standard rather than how it compares with other exhibits. The judge evaluates whether the requirements have been met. Ribbons are awarded according to the degree that the exhibitor's project meets the standards. Also, in the Danish System, everyone whose work fulfils the minimum qualifications receives a ribbon.

"Excellent" Blue Ribbon Award – Exhibits that rank "Excellent meets the standards and fit well within the ability of most of the exhibitors." Excellent does not indicate perfection, but indicates a high degree of achievement toward the elements in the standards for the exhibits \$5.00 Premium

"Good" Red Ribbon Award – Exhibits that rank "Good" in relation to the project standards or expected achievement. Red indicates good quality; however, there is room for improvement in the exhibit. \$3.00 Premium

"Fair" White Ribbon Award - Exhibits that barely meet the product standards and need improvement \$2.00 Premium

"Participant" Red, White & Blue Ribbon Award – no premium monies, does not meet judging standards, but is displayed .00 Premium

Best in Division – The very best of the exhibits. There is no limit to the number of Blue Rosettes awarded. Best of Show awards will be chosen from the Blue Rosette winning exhibit. \$6.00 Premium

Best of Show – One "Best of Show" awarded in some areas of **Arts & Crafts and Plants Department.** \$10.00 Premium

People's Choice, Purple Rosette – This award is determined by votes from the public.
.00 Premium

Green Thumb Award – This award is determined by Master Gardeners. .00 Premium
